- **ELECTRONICS** – Collected for **FREE** by JVS, **ONE TV PER CAR** - Strictly enforced *Township Pool Parking Lot*
- **CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS** – Collected by Construction Junction, materials **MUST** be in useable condition
- **OFF-SITE SHREDDING** – FREE courtesy of State Representative Lori Mizgorski, documents will be securely collected and **taken OFF SITE** to be shredded. **Limit two 13 gallon bags/boxes and no magazines, books, metal or plastic**
- **CELL PHONES, PRINTER CARTRIDGES** – collected at both **High School and JVS Pool Parking Lot** sites

### **\*\* ADDITIONAL GUIDELINES ON ACCEPTED ITEMS\*\***

**BROTHERS BROTHER** - Accepts nebulizers, walkers, manual wheelchairs, bedside commodes, canes, crutches, shower chairs, hospital beds, adult disposable briefs, medical supplies. *For a comprehensive list visit <https://brothersbrother.org/gifts-kind/-med>*

**BATTERIES PLUS – Charges** - 50 cents for each compact fluorescent bulb, 50 cents for each 4ft fluorescent tube bulb, \$1 for each 8ft fluorescent tube bulb

**BOOK COLLECTION:** Anyone can stop by to pick up books during the event. Any remaining books will be donated.

  - Call Waste Management to schedule a pickup of HHW at your home. Some of the items accepted are fluorescent tubes, CFL's, TV's, computers, paint, garden chemicals and cleaners.

  - Free Ride! is a non-profit recycle-a-bike shop that enables people of all ages to obtain, recycle and maintain bicycles. You can also recycle bike helmets here. They are located within Construction Junction's building.

  - Accepts bikes that they in turn refurbish and distribute to people in low income areas.

  - They have a box for recycling rechargeable and also the following batteries: Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), Lithium Ion (Li-ion), Small Sealed Lead (Pb). They also accept CFL (only) light bulbs (**Home Depot** also takes CFL light bulbs.) No fluorescent bulbs accepted.
  - Accepts plastic plant containers, trays and tags in the Garden Center at Lowes.

  - Accepts all kinds of batteries. There is a fee for some CFL and fluorescent bulbs.
- **Central Elementary School on Middle Road**
  - Accepts printer cartridges in the box in the lobby.
- **JT Tire – 412-486-3997**
  - Accepts used tires for a fee.
- **Appliance Warehouse – 1-888-GO-FREON**
  - Allegheny County residents can recycle appliances that are Freon-based such as refrigerators and water heaters. Items can be dropped off in Lawrenceville location, 73 McCandless Avenue free of charge or for a fee you can call to schedule a pick-up right at your house
