



### LEGEND

#### FLOOD PLAINS - Area I

Low lands along streams, valuable water resources; best criterion soil.

- OPEN UNDEVELOPED - 1A. Idle, park, woodlands, farms, golf courses and sportsman's clubs.
- URBAN DEVELOPED - 1B. Industrial, commercial, residential, municipal.

#### STEEP SLOPES - EARTH FLOW PRONE - Area II

Wooded steep slopes prone to earthflow lands (Area II) vegetation is removed. Clay and shale layers, "fretted" horizons, fairly drained.

- OPEN UNDEVELOPED - 1. Idle, park, woodlands, farms, golf courses and sportsman's clubs.
- URBAN DEVELOPED. Industrial, commercial, residential, municipal.

#### STEEP SLOPES - ROCKFALL PRONE - Area III

Wooded steep slopes prone to rockfall lands (Area III) vegetation is removed. Shale and sand layers, well drained.

- OPEN UNDEVELOPED. Idle, park, woodlands, farms, golf courses and sportsman's clubs.
- URBAN DEVELOPED. Industrial, commercial, residential, municipal.

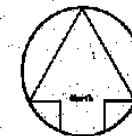
Note: Steep slopes are greater than 20%.
