

MINUTES

PUBLIC HEARING OF HAMPTON TOWNSHIP COUNCIL

WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 13, 2019

President Peters called to order the Public Hearing of Hampton Township Council at 7:30 pm in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building located at 3101 McCully Road, Allison Park, Pennsylvania.

CITIZEN AGENDA MATTERS

Nothing was brought before Council for discussion.

PUBLIC HEARING – HAMPTON HOLISTIC CENTER CONDITIONAL USE (18-09)

Dr. Johnson moved to open the Public Hearing for the Hampton Holistic Center Conditional Use (18-09). Ms. Blackburn seconded the motion and a roll call vote was unanimously in favor.

Mr. Orban stated that the purpose of the Public Hearing is to take public comment on the Hampton Holistic Center Conditional Use application. He summarized the application and noted that it has been reviewed by the Planning Commission and the Township engineer, who are recommending approval. Mr. Orban added that he is also recommending approval of this application.

Rebekah Delling, the owner of Hampton Holistic Center, was in attendance. She provided the address of the business and commented that she is a licensed massage therapist. She reported that she has been in business for 11 years and been a massage therapist for 18 years. Ms. Delling added that she has been licensed ever since licensing became available in Pennsylvania in 2012. She remarked that she requires anyone who works for her to go to an accredited school, carry a license in PA, and belong to a professional organization. She stated that she has very high standards for therapeutic massage and wants to promote the benefits of therapeutic massage in this community. No questions were posed by the members of Council or the audience. Mr. Speakman reported that his wife is a client of this business.

Dr. Johnson moved to close the Public Hearing for the Hampton Holistic Center Conditional Use (18-09). Ms. Blackburn seconded the motion and a roll call vote was unanimously in favor.

Mr. Peters stated that the Council will adjourn to the Agenda Meeting prior to holding the Public Hearing for the Windmont Farms Preliminary PRD (18-06).
