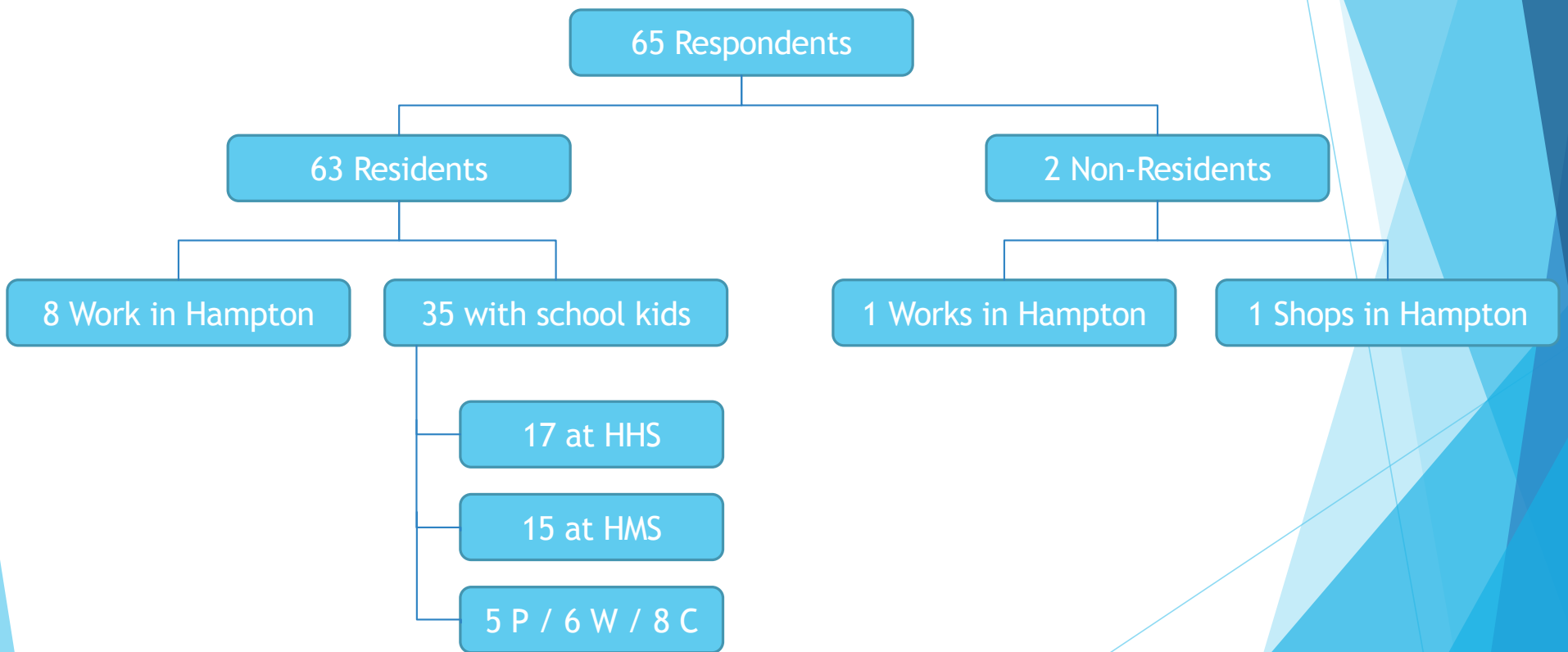




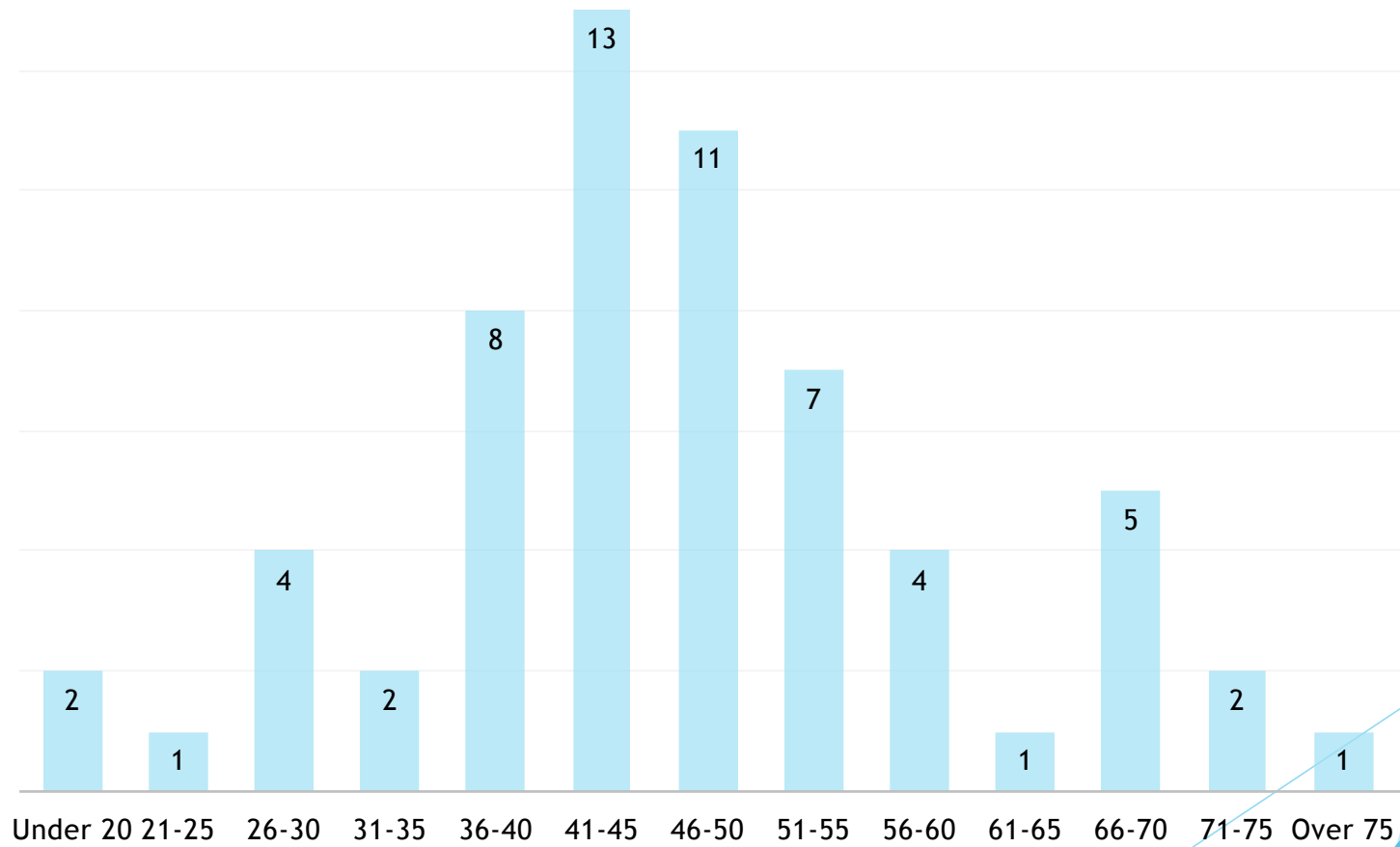

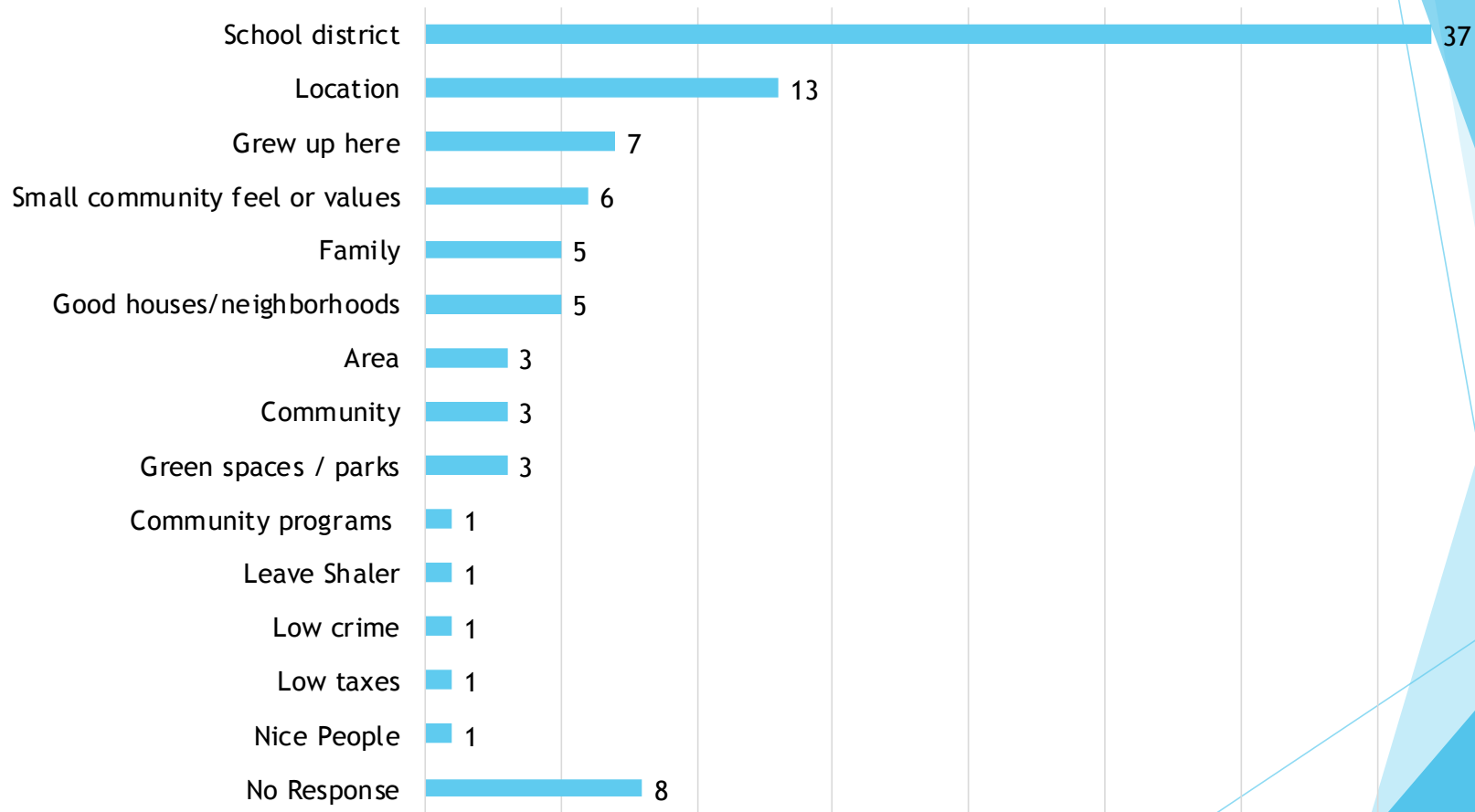


# Age Distribution of Residents

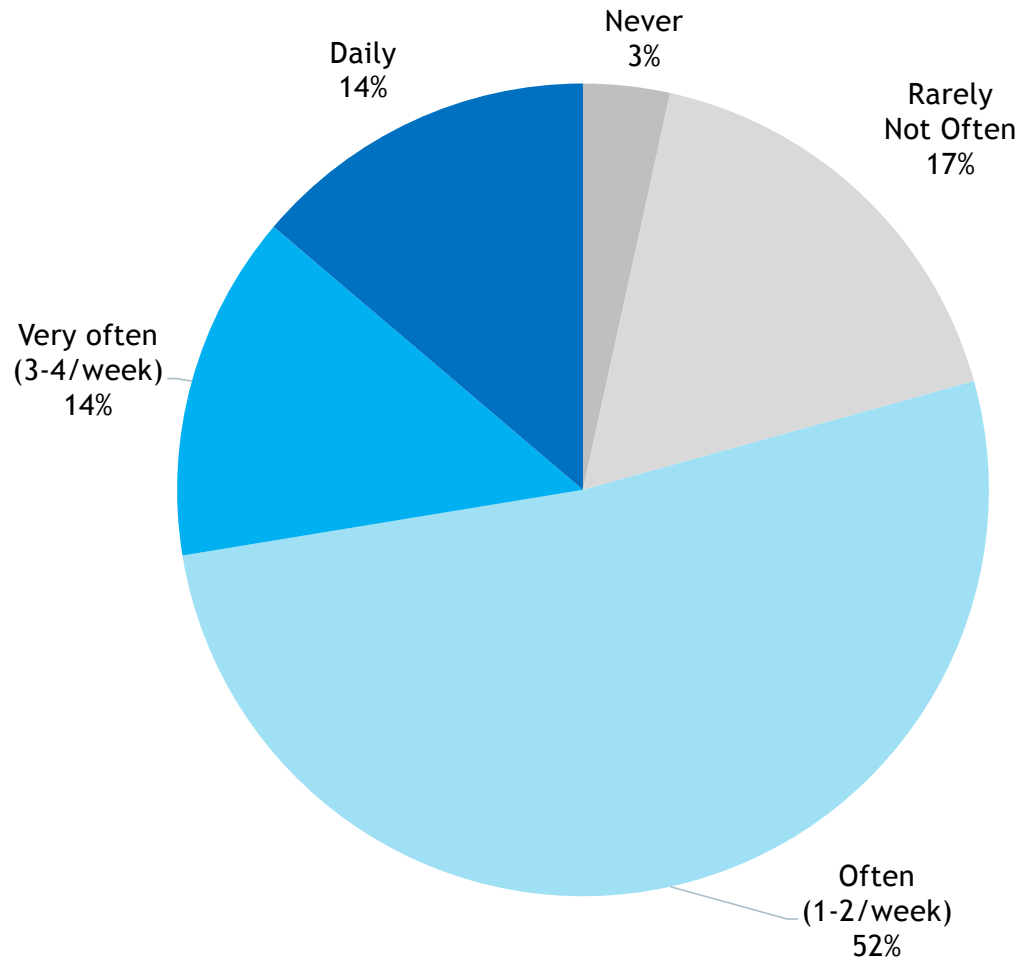


Average = 47 years; range = 15 – 78

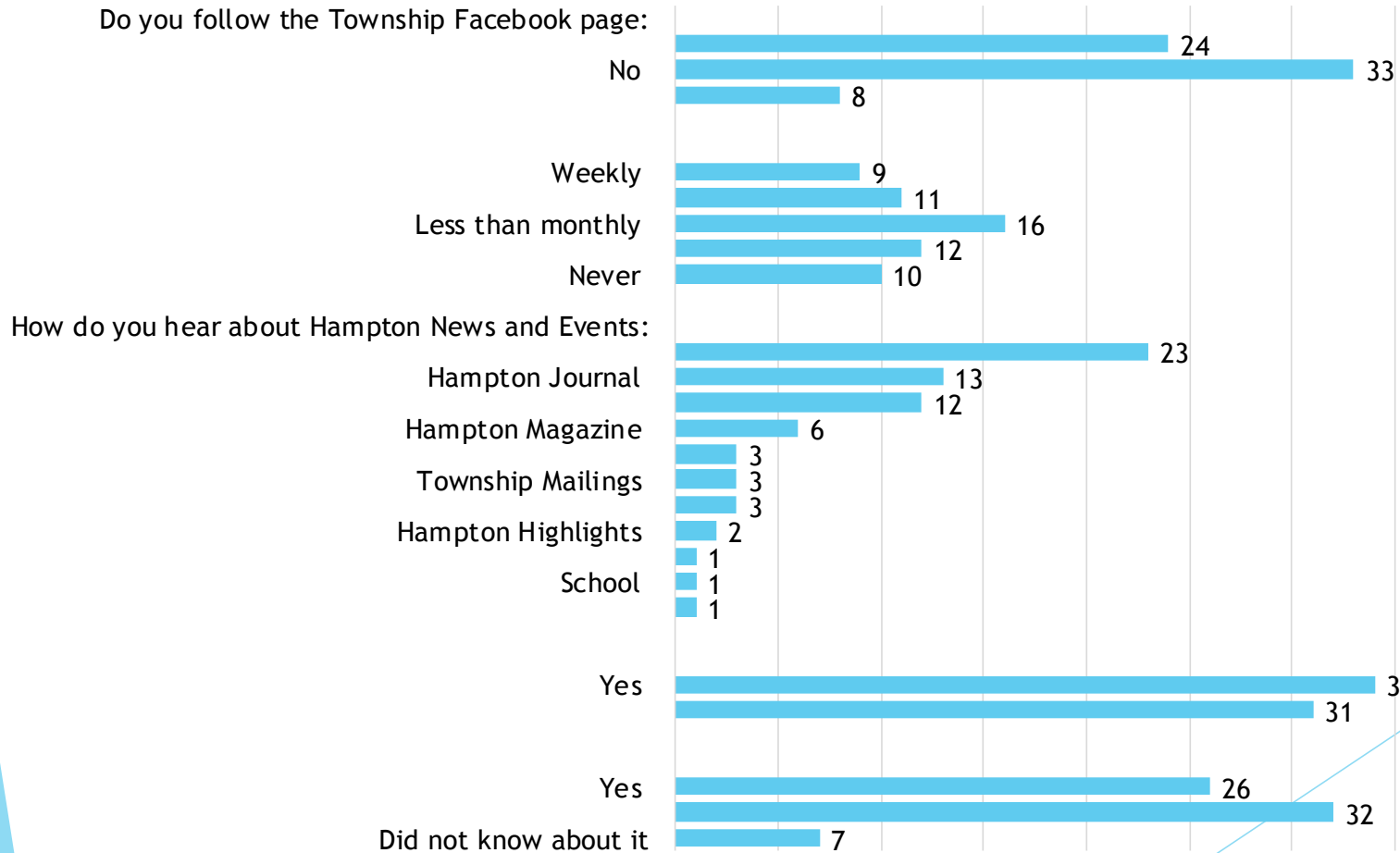
# What Brought People to Hampton?



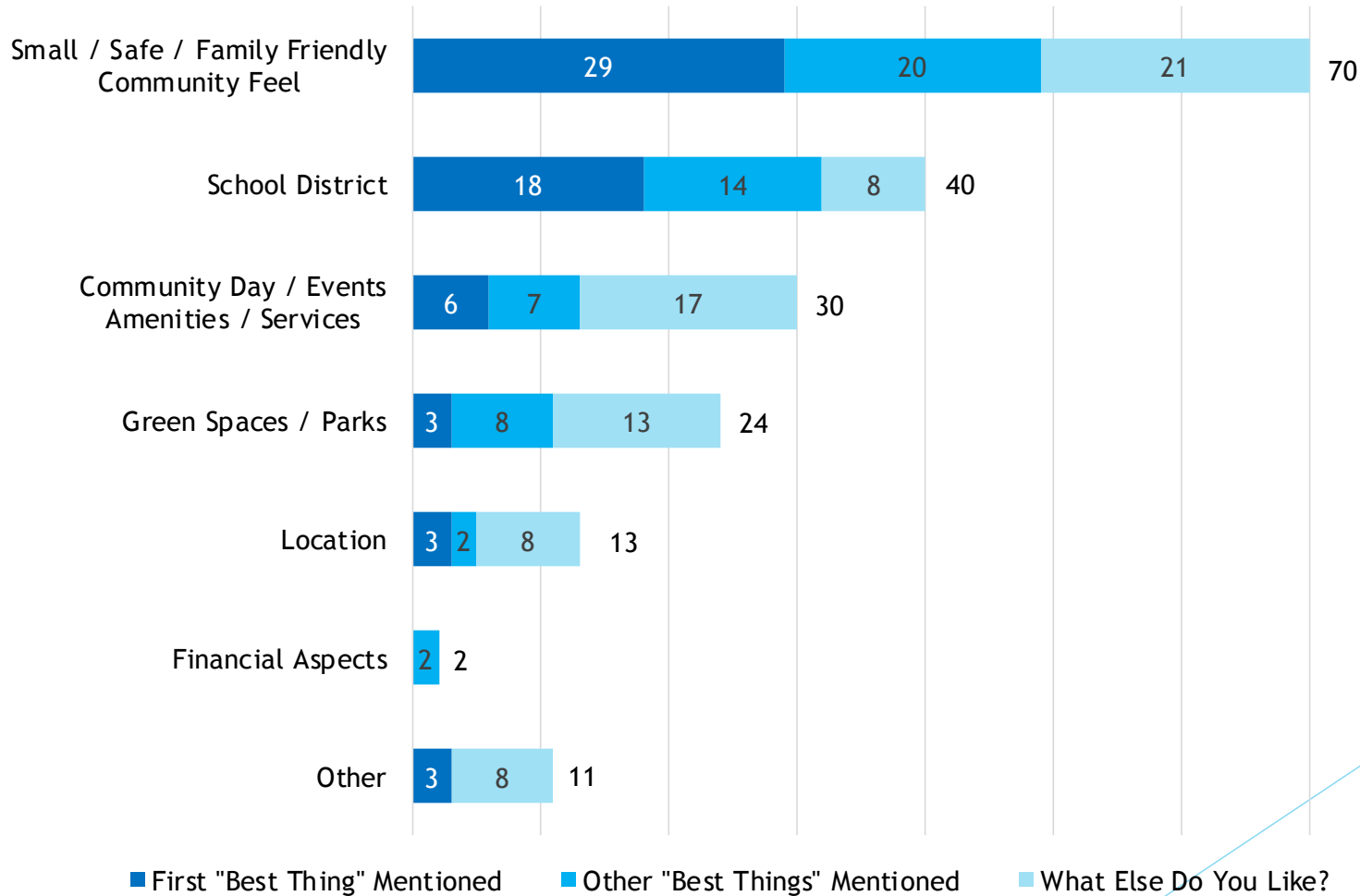
# Shopping Habits in Hampton Stores

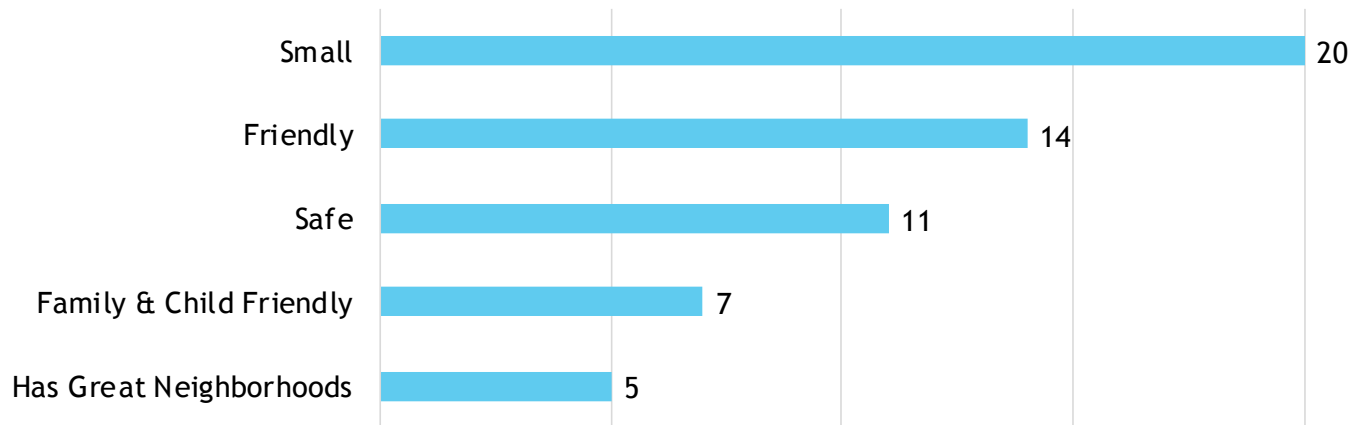

# What People Would Change About Hampton

## **Lack of Downtown, Shopping, Restaurants (21)**

Have a small "downtown Hampton" area, like Mt Lebanon

Upgraded commercial district
